Meeting of stakeholders on "Proposed policy reforms to remove the barriers to CDM A/R Projects" under the EU-ICFRE Project on 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> September 2006

Biodiversity and Climate Change (BCC) Division, ICFRE, Dehradun organized a two days meeting of Stakeholders on 'Proposed Policy reforms to remove the barriers to CDM Afforestation and Reforestation (A/R) Projects' on 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> September 2006 under the European Union project titled 'Beyond Kyoto: EU-India CDM partnership: Promoting Stakeholder Dialogue and Analysis of Barriers to Forestry Mitigation Projects'.

Seventy six delegates representing various Stakeholders from different State Forest Departments, Institutes, NGOs and Farmer Associations participated. Dr. Shashi Kumar, Director (Research), ICFRE welcomed the participants; Shri Jagdish Kishwan, Director General, ICFRE delivered the keynote address; Dr. B. S. Burfal, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Uttaranchal as a Chief Guest of the function delivered the Inaugural Address. The vote of thanks was delivered by Shri Sandeep Tripathi, Head, BCC Division, ICFRE.



The Study carried out by BCC Division, ICFRE was discussed in the above meeting. The identified barriers along with recommendation will be communicated to Government of India for speedy implementation of CDM A/R Projects in India.

# Conservation strategy for Betula utilis D. Don

Betula utilis D. Don (Betulaceae) -Himalayan Silver Birch - commonly known as Bhojpatra, has its global distribution across Afghanistan, Pakistan, Nepal, China and Japan. As far as its distribution in India is concerned, it is found in temperate Himalayas covering both treeline and sub-alpine regions.

The species is present as a pure patch and at times is also associated with *Rhododendron campanulatum* and *Abies spectabilis*. During recent field studies conducted, a pure and undisturbed patch of the Betula forests was recorded and detailed plant diversity studies were conducted in both the sites in Churdhar and Rakcham-Chitkul Wildlife Sanctuaries.





Medicinally, the bark is acrid, pungent, tonic, useful in convulsion, bronchitis, diseases of blood and of the ear. The decoction of the bark is used as a wash in otorrhoea and poisonal wounds. It is also used in jaundice and bilious fevers.

The IUCN threat status of this species is endangered in Himachal Pradesh. It is traded in the name, Bhojpatra and its trade in Amritsar market has increased from 30 qtls in 1996 to 60 qtls in 2003. Therefore, it is suggested by Himalayan Forest Research Institute (HFRI), Shimla that these two areas needs to conserved under *in-situ* conservation and ban should be imposed on wild collection urgently.

#### Fruit colour and germination behaviour in Withania somnifera L. Dunal

Withania somnifera L. Dunal was introduced as an intercrop in 7 years old teak plantation and the crop was harvested after a period of five months. The collected fruits from this crop were segregated into three types on the basis of colour of the fruits viz., green, yellow and red. The segregated seeds based on the colour were sown in soil media without any presowing treatment. The results revealed a greater difference in mean germination percentage. Seeds extracted from red coloured fruit registered greater mean




Variation in pigmentation in seeds from three categories of fruits -Red, Yellow and Green - of *Withania somnifera* 

germination percentage as compared to seeds from yellow and green coloured. On the contrary, when the same sets of seeds were put on filter paper in a Petri-dish at Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding (IFGTB), Coimbatore the germination behaviour was altogether different. The shift in germination behaviour with different fruit colours needs further investigation to improve germination in Withania, particularly under field conditions.

#### Documenting Forest Fungi of Central India


Tropical Forest Research Institute (TFRI), Jabalpur has documented forest

fungi occurring in forests of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. Total 649 specimens of plant parts and 140 soil samples were collected and examined. About 181 documents of forest fungi were prepared in a format developed at this institute, which covers 113 genera of different fungi. During the study two new genera belonging to ascomycete, 17 new species belonging to genera Corynespora (1), Denticularia (1), Hypoxylon (2), Hysterium (1), Kameshwaromyces (1), Mysterosporiella (1), Paathramaya (1), Phomopsis (1), Pseudocercospora (2), Sirosporium (2), Stenella (4) were documented, described and illustrated. In addition 3 new records of fungi from India and 35 new host records were also recognized.

## Internal Monitoring and Evaluation

## International Symposium/ Seminar/Workshop

The Forest Research Institute (FRI), Dehradun in collaboration with International Union of Forestry Research Organization, Vienna and Indian Society of Tree Scientists, UHF, Solan organized an International Symposium on 'Breeding and Improvement of Asian Conifers during 21<sup>st</sup> Century' from September from 11<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> September 2006.

During the conference about 100 participants from different Asian countries participated and presented the research works carried out in their respective countries. There were as many as six technical sessions on genetics and breeding, molecular markers and reproductive biology, advances in silviculture, conservation and management and industrial utilization and economics. A field trip to the coniferous forests of Himalayas at Dhanaulti was also organized.

#### Jatropha Network

Progeny trial of Jatropha was established in Centre for Social Forestry and Eco-Rehabilitation (CSFER), Allahabad nursery under NOVOD Project. Candidate Plus Trees (CPTs) of Jatropha were marked in Eastern U.P. Out of twenty three plus trees of *Jatropha curcas*, CGKP 5 marked at Gorakhpur, Razhi Camp performed best among other trees. The recorded germination percentage was 95%. The survival percent of plants even after ninety days was 100%. This CPT was 5 years old with height of 3.33 m. At nursery stage, this tree of Gorakhpur is most suitable in agroclimatic conditions of Allahabad.

#### Seminars organized

Rain Forest Research Institute (RFRI), Jorhat organized a regional seminar on 'Recent Trends in Biological Control of Insect Pests and Diseases of Forestry Importance' on 18<sup>th</sup> September 2006, which was sponsored by Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India.
