INTERNATIONAL DAY OF FORESTS 2019



Forest Research Institute, Dehradun celebrated International Day of Forests-2019 on 19 March 2019 with the theme "Forests and Education" to sensitize the public and to spread awareness towards the importance of forests in human life. Shri C.K.Mishra, Secretary to Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change was Chief Guest of the event.

Arid Forest Research Institute, Jodhpur

 One species of Diptera collected from nurseries of Chittorgarh, Pratapgarh, Banswara and Dungarpur was identified on belonging to family Diopsidae and one species of Coleopteran defoliator collected from neem and sandal seedlings from Jodhpur identified as Myllocerus species.

- Five species of Lepidoptera, three species of hymenoptera, two species of predatory coleoptera and thirty-five species of aves were identified from Raj Bhawan, Jaipur. Besides nesting of Indian Grey Hornbill (Ocyceros birostris) on neem tree (Azadirachta indica) was also recorded.
- About 600 plants of 19 tree species with varying morphological and phenological characters were planted along the boundary wall as well as roads sides of the newly constructed High Court Campus for intended ecosystem services. The species found least successful at the site are Jacaranda mimosifolia, Plumeria alba and Curvibacter lanceolatus, whereas Santalum album did not survive. Best performing species are Adansonia digitata,

Azadirachta indica, Bauhinia purpurea, Cassia fistula, Dalbergia sissoo, Millingtonia hortensis, Mimusops elengi, Pongamia pinnata and Spathodia campanulata.

Morphological studies were done for 20 male and 20 female Ardu trees. Specific leaf area was higher in male (0.072±0.024 cm²/g) as compared to female (0.070±0.021 cm²/g) leaflet samples. Likewise clear bole height was higher in male (108.95±47.72 cm) as compared with female trees (79.27±36.72 cm).

Forest Research Institute, Dehradun

- Determined Ferric Ion Reducing Anti-oxidant Power Affray (FRAP) and Hydrogen Per-oxide Scavenging (HPS) activity of Rubus ellipticus fruits.
- Dyeing trials on different fabrics using natural dyes derived from *Mimosa himalayana* and *Prosopis julifora* were conducted.
- The content of bioactive marker compound 'betulin' using High Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC) was determined in the bark of three populations of *Betula utilis* found in the forests of Uttarakhand.
- Out of the 250 bacterial isolates isolated from soil samples collected from Kaithal, Fatehabad, Muktsar and Punjab district,

150 isolates were tested for phosphorus solubilisation. However, none of the isolates solubilised phosphate in pikovaskya medium.

- The effect of elevated CO₂ concentration on carbon sequestration, biomass and nutrients accumulation in various parts of important forestry species viz Gmelina arborea, Shorea robusta, Grevillea robusta and Acacia auriculiformis was estimated. Grevillea robusta and Gmelina arborea showed better response to carbon sequestration and biomass accumulation under elevated CO₂ concentration.
- Identification of the collected tettigonids continued under the project "Taxonomic study of Tettigoniidae (Orthoptera) of India (AICOPTAX, MoEF&CC) was carried out.
- Twenty egg parasitoids were sorted out from collected samples and specimens were identified belonging to 5 species: Paracentrobia magniclavata, Paracentrobia longipennis, Pseudoligosita nephotetticum, Oligosita meerutensis and Oligosita novisanguinea. Ten samples of insect eggs were collected Haridwar and Dehra Dun in Uttarakhand from different forestry trees: Tectona grandis,

- Mallotus philippensis, Cassia fistula, Holoptelia integrifolia. Slide preparation and photography are in progress under the project "Studies on diversity and host range of hymenopteran egg parasitoids from northern India (Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand)".
- Sampling was carried out on transects in 5B/C2 Northern Dry Mixed Deciduous Forest at Jilmil Jheel in Haridwar. Database on species of butterflies under different forest types was updated sampled, collected & preserved under the project "Butterflies associated with different forest types/sub-types in Uttarakhand".
- Rearing experiments continued on larvae of 2 species of lepidoptera, collected from ban oak trees during the field surveys for life history studies in the laboratory, while 20 numbers were kept in pupal stages under hibernation. Life cycle of one cerambycid stem borer, Xylotrechus basifuliginosus was studied within the logs kept in the laboratory with emergence of this borer in rearing cages "Insect pests of Western Himalayan Oaks and their Control".
