UNFCCC Meetings on Reducing Emission: Participation of ICFRE

The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) convened the 26th Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technical Advise / Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBSTA / SBI) Meetings from 7th to 18th May 2007 at Bonn, Germany.

During SBSTA among other issues, the following important issues related to Land Use, Land Use Change and Forestry (LULUCF) were deliberated at length: i) Reducing Emission from Deforestation and Degradation in developing countries (REDD), ii) Demonstrating the eligibility of land for Clean Development Mechanism Afforestation and Reforestation A&R) Projects and iii) Increasing the limit for small scale CDM A&R Projects. As an outcome, Clean Development Mechanism Executive Board (CDM EB) in its 31st meeting has again decided to call for public input on issue of demonstrating land eligibility for CDM A&R projects. ICFRE has made its submission as observer organization to UNFCCC and also through Government of India. Regarding increasing the limits of small scale CDM A&R projects, India has a position not to increase the limit at present.

ICFRE delegation comprising of Shri Jagdish Kishwan, DG - ICFRE and Shri Sandeep Tripathi, Head, BCC Division put forcefully its input and intervention on the issue of REDD. On this hotly debated issue of REDD, the Indian concept of "Compensated Reduction" got wide support during SBSTA - 26. US also supported India's stand by asserting that

a "range of actions" to reduce emissions from deforestation need to be considered. which according to US, should also include "Forest Conservation and Stabilization" efforts also. European Union (EU) considered using the phrase "range of actions" as a compromise formula because of Brazil's opposition to the Indian proposal. Congo Basin countries lead by Cameroon/Gabon stressed on including 'stabilization of forests' as the policy approach suitable to countries in their region with low rate of deforestation. Since stabilization is an outcome of the process of conservation, India supported Congo Basin approach. Many countries including Indonesia, Malaysia, Bangladesh and Singapore also expressed support.

Highpoint of the process was isolation of Brazil in the G-77 and China forum on the issue of REDD as well as open support to Indian position by China, Singapore, and strong indirect support by Coalition of Rainforest Nations, US and Congo Basin Countries.

Outbreak of alien forest invasive species, Leptocybe invasa, on Eucalyptus in Madhya Pradesh

The blue gum chalcid, Leptocybe invasa Fisher and LaSalle (Hymnoptera: Chalcidoidea: Eulophidae), is a gall inducing waspin Eucalyptus

species which probably originated from Australia. It was first noticed in India during the year 2002 from coastal Tamil Nadu and now it has spread over to peninsular India. The pest has already affected vast areas of Eucalyptus plants in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Kerala. As reported by the scientists of Tropical Forest Research Institute (TFRI), Jabalpur this alien invasive species has



entered Madhya Pradesh too as the outbreak of gall maker was observed in nurseries and plantations of Eucalyptus during the month of May 2007.

Validating Tissue Cultured Bamboo through Multilocational Trial

Locational trial and demo plantation of micro and macro propagated plants of three commercially important bamboo species viz., *Bambusa balcooa, B. nutans* and *Dandrocalamus hemiltonii* have been laid out by RFRI, Jorhat in all the 7 states of Northeast India under the Department of Biotechnology-National Mission on Bamboo Applications (DBT-NMBA) sponsored project. Field performance and growth of micro propagated plants of all the three bamboo species are encouraging.

Litsea cubeba - A Lesser Known Promising Plant of North east India

Plants provide a multitude of flavours and fragrances. *Litsea cubeba* is one such plant growing in NE India, which has a great potential of economic development of the area by adopting its cultivation for essential oil and silkworm rearing.

L. cubeba, commonly known as MajanKari, is a small tree, 5-12 m high with a stem diameter of 6-20 cm, occurs mainly in mountainous regions up to 2700 m above

mean sea level. Most of the plant parts possess aromatic compounds and yield volatile oils with organoleptis properties. Flowers and fruits are used for flavouring

tea and vegetables. Oil can be extracted by distillation of small, pepper like fruits. It is rich in citral (about 80 percent) and has an intensely lemon-like, fresh, sweet odour. The fruit is edible. It is aromatic and carminative and used for remedy of headache, dizziness, hysteria, paralysis and loss of memory. Leaves and fruits are used as insect repellant. Local tribes use its fruits as preservative for fish.

Yields of oil distilled from the fruit are reported to be 3-5 percent. The plant is also used as a secondary host for Munga silkworm. Wood of *L. cubeba* is sometimes used for making furniture and handicrafts.

Wild rose in Miyad valley

The rose - according to fossil evidence- is around 35 million years old. In nature, Genus Rosa has some 150 species spread throughout the Northern Hemisphere, from Alaska to Mexico and including northern Africa.

Himalayan Forest Research Institute (HFRI), Shimla during recent floristic





survey of the remote 'Miyad Valley' in Lahaul and Spiti - the tribal district of Himachal Pradesh has encountered a wild species of rose with yellow flowers. The yellow flowered species has been reported as *Rosa eglanteria L*.

The rose shrub encountered was a dense deciduous shrub 2-3 m high, with the stems bearing numerous hooked prickles. The foliage when crushed, had a strong apple-like fragrance. Flowers are in clusters of 2-7, with notched tips, bright yellow in colour. The fruit is a globose to oblong red hip, edible.

Moreover, only a few shrubs of this species were seen near Urgos village (3480 m amsl) and near Changut (3400 m amsl) in association with *Juniperus macropoda, Ribes alpestre* and *Rosa webbiana*.

Protocols for rapid clonal propagation of sandal and red sanders

Institute of Wood Science and Technology (IWST), Bangalore, has refined a protocol developed for *in vitro* cloning of sandal through auxiliary shoot proliferation, somatic embryogenesis and adventitious shoot induction.

It also standardized physico-chemical condition for shoot initiation and multiplication of red sanders and Plant Genetic Resources (PGRs) for rooting.

World Environment Day celebrations
