Thereafter, various field technologies were demonstrated in KVK farm to the trainees by resource persons facilitated by **Dr. Amitesh Sharma**, SMS, PBG KVK Doda. To further benefit the participants, a complete session was conducted in the evening as interactive session among participants and experts from HFRI, Shimla and KVK Doda. During this session participants expressed their opinion about medicinal plants cultivation and freely interacted with the resource persons. Relevant queries of the participants pertaining to various issues regarding cultivation of medicinal plants in the field, marketing etc. were duly addressed through expert opinion of the resource persons. The event was extensively covered by local print media and FM radio Bhaderwah.
