
SIGNIFICANT RESEARCH ACHIEVEMENTS

ICFRE - Rain Forest Research Institute (RFRI), Jorhat, has successfully completed the soil collection and analysis for the preparation of Soil Health Cards for all Forest Divisions in the state of Tripura.



Development of Regeneration Database for Forest Genetic Resources of North East India

ICFRE-RFRI has developed a regeneration database for 100 economically important Forest Genetic Resource (FGR) species that are native to Northeast India. This database marks a significant step in the direction of sustainable forest management in the region.



Abanddoned Coal-Mined Land in Meghalaya successfully restored

A 6.5-hectare area of abandoned coal-mined land near Latyrke Village, in the Saipung Block of East Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya, has been successfully restored by the plantation of approximately 32 native plant species with the assistance of plant growth-promoting rhizobacteria (PGPR) and Arbuscular Mycorrhizal Fungi (AMF). This restoration initiative, titled "Restoration of Degraded Coal Mined Land of Meghalaya through Soil Amendment and Microbial Technology for Accelerated Succession," was funded by the Directorate of Mineral Resources, Government of Meghalaya.


ICFRE-RFRI Hosts Virtual Training on Forest Seed Technology and Nursery Management

Workshop on GIS Application in Forestry and Ecology Held at Jagannath Barooah College






Dr. Dhruba J. Das and Manimoy Das attend Workshop on Climate-Driven Effects on Indian Forests




